- -ESSER (Elementary & Secondary School Emergency Relief) Funding:
 - o "ESSER III Educational Plan SCC".
 - The purpose of ESSER Funds is to mitigate the effects of COVID-19 pandemic and outlines the Department's priorities to ensure academic success, as well as the well-being of our students and staff.

- Examples: Summer Hub, Kindergarten Transition Program (summer)
- 3 Major Focus Areas: Health & Safety, Accelerated Learning (catching students up), Social-Emotional Learning (for students and staff) align with Interim State Superintendent Keith Hayashi's Vision/Focus

• Feedback from SCC members:

- To what degree do we understand the purpose of ESSER funds?
 SCC understands what the ESSER funds are for.
 - No questions were raised.
- Per Principal Takeguchi, you can't use the funds for: resurfacing football fields, massage chairs for teachers, purchasing gym memberships, it should pass the "Fish Test"--if it smells fishy, it's probably not a good use of the ESSER funds.
- To what degree are you satisfied with funding the three major areas (Health and Safety, Accelerate Learning, Social Emotional Learning)?
- Question: Does the health have to be only for COVID supplies?
 Can it be used to pay for a P.E. teacher?
- Question: How about sporting equipment for recess? Student reps shared that they do not get to play with balls, parents also mentioned that kids want more equipment.

NEW BUSINESS:

• PRE's ESSER Plan

- o \$44,775 First Allocation
- SCC does not need to improve this plan
 - Must be used January 2022 June 2022
 - Minimum 75% must address learning loss
 - i-Ready
 - ESSER funds will pay for this year's iReady & PTA will pay for next year's iReady
 - After school tutoring / RTI: Details are still being worked on, will be communicated to teachers and families and will be from 2:30pm - 3:30pm starting in 2nd Semester.
 - PD: Looking at Orton-Gillingham initially, but now possibly Anita Archer's Core Phonics program
 - Maximum 25% can address Safe Return to School
 - Air Purifiers-for every classroom & learning space
 - Cleaning/disinfection--have had to purchase a lot more supplies in the past two years
 - Recess Equipment / Resources looking at options for equipment.
- o \$75,839 Second Allocation (Still Awaiting Approval)
 - Must be used SY 22-23
 - -still waiting for approval
 - -this money is for the entire school year
